April Means Springtime Chores

As your bonsai collection grows in quantity and quality, the coming of spring means time for work. Besides an initial fertilizer feeding, the real task is to repot deciduous trees before the buds break. Timing re-potting at this point means the roots are at their most viable after the winter rest. Roots are fully prepared to raise nutrients to the buds and force the leaves into the light. For this reason re-potting now has less of a stunning effect on the tree as a whole and the possibility of leaf loss is at a minimum. Once the buds have broke and the leaves are forming, it is too late for re-potting as now the leaves need the roots performing at full capacity and the tree cannot afford to be stressed.

Our meeting this Saturday will involve and offer the time, supplies and tools one needs to get those trees re-potted. I know for myself there is never enough spring available to get my trees potted before the heat arrives or the leaves are out. While re-potting is not the most glamorous part of the bonsai hobby, it is one of the few times we get to observe and work on the root structure of our trees.

Additionally, those of us who are now raising bonsai mums, we will want to bring them, this Saturday, for the next step in our development process.

2009 Air-Layer a Success / Bonsai Mums in March

The March meeting had several moving parts to it. First, Pat spoke about possibly getting Ryan Neal (apprentice to Masahiko Kimura) to come to Reno, in May. Second, we observed the results of the Feb. 2009 maple air-layering. When the tree was removed from its pot, there were ample new roots in the layered area. Next, meeting attendees selected 4" Chrysanthemum starts to bonsai. Each plant was repotted, with the lowest bud in mind as the future structure. The plants will be



pruned, fertilized and attended to over the next several months and should be brought to each future meeting to monitor development. To finish up members worked on re-potting their various trees, as early Spring is one of the optimum times for this task. Of course Pat had a plentiful supply of his homemade bonsai soil available.
